

Eligible to start:

Judoka (female and male) with mental and/or physical disabilities of all ages with a valid Special Olympics license 2025. Participants from Austrian clubs must also present a valid judo license from Judo Austria 2025. If athletes do not yet have a valid Special Olympics athlete license, they can apply for one via the **Special Olympics database**.

Athletes from other nations are eligible to compete with a photo ID and a valid medical certificate that must not be older than one year.

The judokas are divided into competition classes on site as part of the draw.

Levels:

Level 1:

Level 1 is a judoka who can perform in a competition with a normal recreational or competitive judoka. This judoka is fast and powerful and has an excellent responsiveness.

He has a strong feeling for judo and an excellent strategic perspective. This type of judoka has minimal disability and therefore usually attends a regular school. In general, these are judoka with a social or mild physical disability, visually impaired and deaf judoka and judoka with a mental disability that has grown beyond level 2.

Level 2:

Level 2 is a judoka who can perform randori with a normal recreational judoka. This judoka is fast and powerful and has moderate responsiveness, but usually reacts late to judo-specific situations. He has a good feeling for judo, but usually doesn't have an effective strategy.

Level 3:

Level 3 is a judoka who can perform a playful randori with a normal recreational judoka. can carry out. This judoka is reasonably fast and powerful and has a reasonably developed ability to react, but almost always reacts too late to situational judo. The strategy for this judoka is often to repeat the same technique over and over again.

Level 4:

Level 4 is a judoka who can fight with another judoka of the same or comparable level. The ability to react is limited. Usually, the only judo technique consists of simple throws and holds.

Level 5:

Level 5 is a judoka who can fight other judoka of the same level. These judokas are very passive or react very slowly. Constant coaching is necessary. If they are in a hold, the action to free them can take a long time.





By registering, the reporting clubs/institutions guarantee the athletes' ability to compete (health pass) and adequate insurance coverage. As part of divisioning, levels can be combined and the competition classes can be divided to make the championship feasible. If a judoka's disability does not allow a fight in Tachi-Waza, the fight will be carried out in Ne-Waza. This should be announced when registering.

Restrictions: No Shime-waza and Kansetsu-wasa! Sangaku techniques and all

self-falling techniques are not allowed. Flips in Ne-Waza fights are scored as a roll. In Ne-Waza fights it is forbidden to push the opponent straight backwards while kneeling (risk of injury!). It is

forbidden to put pressure on the throat, head or neck.

Fight time: Level 1 & 2: 3 minutes, Golden Score: max 3 minutes

Level 3-5: 2 minutes, Golden Score: max. 2 minutes

System o competion: Round-robin

Award: Prizes will be awarded to those placed.

Cost: Each participant/club bears his/her own costs.

Liability: The organizer assumes no liability for injuries or the like.
